How to use the worksheet.

1. I usually run through a simple role play with me as the server and the students as my customers. They listen as we interact and when we are finished I have them tell me what they remember.

2. Drill the conversation again and again to help the students remember the language.

3. Role play the conversation with the students in groups, some play the part of the servers and others the part of the customers.

Note:

Some students enjoy this lesson a little too much and don't focus on the language being used and simply fall into the role play. **FOCUS ON THE LANGUAGE!** Make sure you review, question and test them throughout the activity.
