Using the Worksheet

This is a nice review of counters that are often used in English. Using it is pretty simple. The types of containers are already listed on the shape from 1 to 12. Students work alone or in pairs if possible and choose which ones go with which.

If you aren't able to print a lot of these you can always do the activity without by simply practicing orally.

Who is the sheet for?

This might work best with some young people's classes or children's classes. I don't tend to use any worksheets at all with adults and prefer to handle questions like this in context as they come up. It's silly to expect someone to suddenly memorize and then perfectly use all these words in all their encounters and future conversations. Stick with the ones that are helpful for you and your students and don't worry about the rest.
