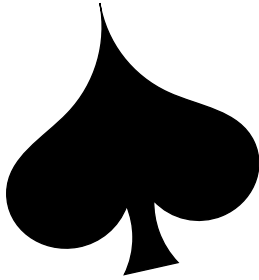


Digits

B: Sounds great!

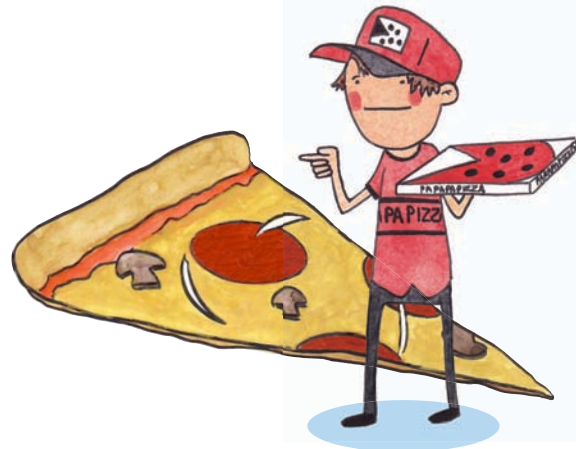


Formal
