How to use the worksheets:

- **1.** Model the sounds and the mouth positions.
- 2. Students work in pairs or small groups to put the words in groups based on the pronunciation.
- **3.** Check students answers and practice the sounds together.

There's lots of room for variation and fun by racing or calling out sounds in big voices with lots of energy.

And just in case you're not sure what exactly is going on here; verbs in English have different styles of pronunciation when they are in the past tense. Some sound like a T, like asked, washed, and helped. Others sound like a D, like tied, rained, and played. And others have a clear ED sound like visited, ended, and rented.
